### Expert hired over 'mansionization'

**DOWNEY**—The Downey City Council has authorized the Mayor to execute an agreement with Downtown Solutions for consultant services to provide a residential code amendment regarding large two-story single family dwellings and authorized the expenditure of \$38,000 in Community Block Grant money for the consulting services.

The action at Tuesday's regular meeting was by a 4-1 vote with Councilman Meredith Perkins opposed. (He, like many speakers from the audience, asked why the expenditure of \$38,000 was necessary when the City has a skilled staff.)

#### Overworked staff

The majority of the Council agreed with Councilman Kirk Cartozian who maintained staff is already stretched thin by other projects. About 30 speakers were heard from the packed audience before the issue came to a

A staff report noted that the Council directed staff at its July 12 meeting to revisit the issue of revising the Municipal Code regarding two-story single-family homes in the R-1 zones. A subcommittee consisting of councilmembers Kirk Cartozian and David Gafin was also formed.

After a series of meetings between the staff and Subcommittee it was determined advisable to hire a consultant with experience regarding this type of code amendment.

Mark Brodeur

Mark Brodeur of Downtown Solutions has worked with communities and is well versed in this subject. He included in his proposal two

### |North American days| at the Downey plant

Previously in this series we touched on the origins of aerospace at Downey with the purchase of a 73 acre tract of land here by E. M. Smith to be converted to an aircraft plant and small airstrip completed in 1929.

But the Depression stifled sales and a series of manufacturers were less than successful until Jerry Vultee moved his Aviation Manufacturing Corporation here from Glendale in 1936. Vultee's engineering genius was tragically snuffed out in 1938 when he and his wife died in an air crash. But he was succeeded as president and general manager in 1940 by Richard Palmer, a genius in his own right, and the plant was named for Vultee.

### Retooling

Sales had picked up and suddenly constant retooling was needed to meet demand. Vultee bought 34 percent of Consolidated Aircraft in San Diego. Vultee's ability to retool and increase production made it the envy of the industry during World War II.

The Vultee Division of Convair was awarded a Navy contract for the LARK surface-to-air missile in 1945. A contract to study long-range missile systems followed, and although it was cancelled in 1946 due to economic cuts, much of the research paid off later in 1950 as part of the Atlas Project.

### **North American**

In 1947 North American which had many contracts to fill, leased a portion of the Vultee plant here to produce its AJ-1 Navy bomber and T-28

In 1951 North American named the Downey facility the Missile Airframe and Control Equipment (MACE), and in 1953 swapped the site with the Air Force in exchange for Air Force Plant (AFP) 27 in Los Angeles. The Downey plant became known at AFP 16, and remained so until 1964. It was primarily used by North American to develop a new missile concept—the Navaho.

### Scandinavian food, and much more...

**DOWNEY**—Have a taste for Swedish meatballs? Want to try Norwegian meatballs? Or maybe you'd like buttermilk pancakes, fish and chips, or chorizo and eggs.

Each of these dishes can be found at one place in Downey: The Nordic Fox, located at 10924 Paramount Blvd. In fact, according to Nordic Fox Manager Joe Becker, it's the only Scandinavian restaurant in Southern California.

This family-style restaurant, which has stood at the corner of Paramount and Third Street since 1968, has the appearance and atmosphere of a cabin you'd find in the mountains rather than a coffee shop that would be located on a main thoroughfare in a suburb of Los Angeles.

### **Music on Sundays**

Live music is featured on Sunday nights, and the restaurant's gift shop is stocked with authentic Scandinavian items such as jewelry, cookbooks,

### 'Fill the boot' raises \$44K for ravaged area

DOWNEY-In the words of Downey Fire Chief Mark Sauter, the community's response to last Saturday's Fire Department-sponsored 'fill the boot' fundraising event held at Stonewood Mall for Hurricane Katrina's victims was "simply overwhelming."

The fundraiser, manned by firefighters and their families, fire explorers and fire auxiliaries who positioned themselves at the mall's five entrance driveways, elicited such nonstop outpouring of generosity from shoppers and the public that the fire crew volunteers, told that the event was supposed to be over by 3 p.m., radioed back, "We're having trouble stopping....The shoppers won't stop 'filling the boot." The activities finally ceased at half past 3.

Over \$6,000 was collected in the first hour alone. The first person to make an official donation at precisely 10 a.m. wrote a personal check for \$500. Even before that, a man had driven up and asked if it was okay to donate a \$100 bill.

The rate of donations never slowed, keeping the volunteers busy. Children, teenagers, young adults, and seniors all slowed their cars and filled the boot.' Many stopped mid-street to write a check spontaneously. Huge numbers of shoppers handed over handfuls of cash. Many children appeared to be contributing their allowances and still others emptied their change into the firefighters' boots. A few drivers originally seen complaining because of the slight traffic delay, were later spotted slowing down and voluntarily plunking down their donations. The countenance of choice was friendly, and smiles permeated the surroundings. The spirit of giving was nothing short of contagious.

Total take was in excess of \$44,000. The amount, which has been turned over to the Red Cross, included over 150 pounds of coins, worth

Aside from the community's compassionate display, teamwork suffused the scene. Snacks were provided by Third Street Coffee, lunch by Fidal at Marisa's Mexican Restaurant. The Downey Federal Credit Union volunteered their services and assisted counting the coins. A number of the Miss Downey and Miss Teen Downey princesses showed up and pitched in to help as well.

Fundraising for the disaster relief effort was not confined to

Stonewood Mall. The City Clerk's Office coordinated the internal contributions over at City Hall. Letters of solicitation were distributed beforehand and Red Cross cans were placed strategically throughout the city.

In the meantime, the six Downey firefighters assigned to the Biloxi, Mississippi area continue their relief work for the residents of the stricken area. Arriving in the Biloxi area on Sept. 5, the three teams of firefighters have been working for FEMA ever since. Their relief work has required them to cover the three hardest-hit Mississippi Gulf Cost counties.

**DOWNEY**—The City Council has approved the use of incentives to attract police officers to bring the number of Downey Police up to mandated levels.

The action at Tuesday's regular Council meeting includes allowing lateral transfers to carry over accumulated sick-leave from their old jobs, up

The officers could also carry over such perks as vacation time of up to 80 hours. And once hired, actual rate of vacation time will be based on their years of police tenure.

### Recruiting

In addition, policy will now credit Downey officers 40 hours of time off for recruiting a lateral transfer who successfully completes the hiring process. The staff report notes that, compared to other high-dollar perks used by other agencies, this is a reasonable expense, when competing for



But the Navaho experienced a series of test setbacks and in 1957 the government terminated the program. Of 11,000 employed at the Downey facility, 4,000 were laid off. But within three months North American won a major new contract for the Hound Dog air-to-ground Missile

and coffee mugs.

The business is owned by Becker's aunt, Jane Hendricks. Both he and Hendricks are Downey residents, and both are of Swedish descent.

"When we bought the restaurant, it was called 'Foxy's", Becker said, "So one of the problems we had when we took over the restaurant was we had the heritage of Foxy's—we kind of wanted to keep that, but we also wanted to say we were new. So that's when we came up with the name 'Nordic Fox."

The addition of Scandinavian foods to the menu soon followed. September 22, 2005, will mark the fourth year Hendricks has owned the business.

Becker wasn't sure exactly how they will celebrate.

"I don't know. We thought we'd have almost like a grand re-opening—we may make some menu changes, and have a party type thing. We're working on those details right now."

#### That sign...

So why is there a "For Lease" sign facing Paramount Boulevard outside the restaurant?

"That's kind of our ugly story," Becker said. "To help us get a little more extra money, we sold the building about eight months ago, with the idea of doing a lease back on it," he explained.

"Our impression was that the gentleman who bought it just wanted to own the property, and have us, you know, make the mortgage payments for him. Well, apparently he had other ideas because one day they came and put up the For Lease sign, and they said they were gonna build...seven little stores here. And when we asked him about it, he says. 'Well, we're just kind of trying it right now to see what kind of take I get.'"

Becker said there is an option in the three-year lease he and Hendricks have with the building's current owner.

"If he wants to tear it down, he can throw us out with sixty days notice...and it said if we decided to move, we could give sixty days notice. But we didn't really plan on moving anywhere."

So far, the new owner hasn't given Becker and Hendricks a deadline to move.

"No—no kind of notice at all," Becker said. "Not even saying it'll be over a year, or it'll be only sixty-one days."

Becker said there are people making efforts to save the building, and even the Los Angeles Conservancy has gotten involved. But he's unsure if the efforts will be successful.

Still, The Nordic Fox remains a unique restaurant, where diners can enjoy Scandinavian and American food, listen to live music, and purchase authentic Scandinavian gifts.

The sign was taken down this week without explanation.

### Motorists feeling the back-to-school blues

**DOWNEY** – They say Lakewood and Firestone Boulevards, what with Lakewood once having been a major thoroughfare between Pasadena and the Port of Long Beach, was once one of the busiest intersections in

This was in the olden days, when Johnie's Broiler sold hamburgers, not hatchbacks, and the term 'mansionization' wasn't even a real word.

Years later Downey is still, in my opinion, home to one of the busiest intersections in the world: Firestone and Brookshire Avenue. At 3 p.m. On a school day. Grrr!

Firestone and Brookshire at that time is chaos; think the Running of the Bulls in Spain or a million Japanese fleeing Godzilla.

What the children are fleeing, of course, is school. And in doing so they collide head-on with traffic running east and west on Firestone, already stalled thanks to ongoing construction now in its 10th year of operation.

And for teenagers, full of youth and invigoration, they sure do take their sweet time crossing the street.

Further south on Brookshire lays Downey Regional Medical Center, across the street from a pharmacy, around the corner from Downey Retirement Center. And that means old people. Old people with vision problems. Old people with vision problems in big Cadillacs.

For an onlooker, Firestone and Brookshire is a curious sight: 90-yearold ladies with oversized, old-person sunglasses sitting alongside teenagers with oversized, young-person sunglasses, collectively waiting for the light to turn green.

A viable alternative to the mess is dusty Stewart and Gray, disorganized in its own right with laborers scurrying to complete Downey Landing, but if Downey is a heart, Firestone is its artery, and right now it's clogged.

Of course, traffic problems are sure to ease up when construction dies down and lanes reopen. But until then, 'minimum day' won't be just a break for students, but for motorists as well.

### Fill the boot

As a result of the fire department's quick response to the request for disaster aid and because of their familiarity with the command structure at major emergencies, a number of the Downey firefighters have been placed in leadership positions for the specialized response teams. The teams are presently working out of the Stennis NASA Space Center, which is halfway between New Orleans and Bay St. Louis. The base housed over 3,500 local residents who chose to ride out Hurricane Katrina rather than evacuate the area. Besides managing the other teams, the Downey firefighters have been assisting in the operation of the recently built Disaster Assistance Center at the base.

The firefighters report they seem to have touched a responsive chord among the residents as well, especially when they learn how far the teams have traveled to render aid (some 1,200 miles). They acknowledge being part of the overall disaster response has been "very rewarding."

The reason for their being there in the first place: FEMA considered the urgency of the delivery of disaster services and the abilities of the nation's firefighters when they chose to utilize firefighters for the 1,000 two-person disaster relief teams.

Inspection Misconceptions!


