Symphony will tap itself for talent

DOWNEY—For the next concert of the Downey Symphony, scheduled for tomorrow evening, Feb. 4 in the Downey Civic Theater, Conductor Thomas Osborn will present as soloists four principal musicians from the orchestra, Catherine Del Russo, on oboe; Duncan Massey, bassoon; Carolyn Osborn, violin; and Mary Anne Steinbergen, cello.

“All are terrific performers in their own right,” Osborn said, “And they deserve to have the spotlight in every way.”

That spotlight will shine in a work by Franz Joseph Haydn, his Sinfonia Concertante, written during an especially happy and successful time in Haydn’s life when his new compositions were sending Russian audiences into raptures. “This is wonderful work,” Osborn continues, our soloists play it beautifully. People will be thrilled to hear it.”

Credentials for these soloists would stretch from the theater’s stage to Row M at a minimum. All perform regularly with fine local orchestras from Santa Barbara to Riverside County.

They are active in recording studios in Los Angeles, film, TV and commercial work, or teach at Southern California universities and colleges, and all have played under Tom Osborn’s baton for years. What a treat it will be to watch those skillful hands bring music to life.

Also on the program, the second concert of the orchestra’s 48th season, are the Orchestral Suite No. 3 by J.S. Bach, Le Tombeau de Couperin by Maurice Ravel and the Classical Symphony of Serge Prokofiev.

Reserved seat tickets from \$10 to \$25 are available at theater box office before the 8 p.m. performance time. Free to ticket holders is Dr. Osborn’s preview discussion of the music of the evening which will precede the concert itself at 7:15 p.m. The Downey Theater is at 8435 Firestone Blvd., at the corner of Brookshire.

Rancho to stay open three more years

DOWNEY – Rancho Los Amigos Hospital will remain open for at least three more years, thanks to a settlement reached this week by Los Angeles County and plaintiffs who sued to keep the rehabilitation center from closing.

The county had sought to shut down the hospital, claiming the closure would save \$58.6 million annually, but a preliminary injunction upheld by the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals two years ago barred the closure, ruling that services offered at Rancho were critical to patients and could not be had at other local hospitals.

“Plaintiffs presented ample evidence that rehabilitative services and treatment for complex and disabling medical conditions, such as paralysis and conditions associated with severe diabetes, cannot currently be provided effectively anywhere in the county system but Rancho,” Circuit Judge Harry Pregerson wrote in the appellate ruling.

Under terms of the settlement, the county can close Rancho after three years if it can prove existing Medi-Cal patients will still have access to needed care. In the meantime, the county must improve operations at the rehabilitation center to improve efficiency while making “good faith efforts to find another entity to assume Rancho’s operations,” according to court documents.

Plaintiffs can file another lawsuit against the county in three years.

Rancho Los Amigos serves an estimated 11,200 patients each year, most with long-term disabilities.

Redistricting fairly is biggest challenge

They’ve tried every other means to draw fair and equitable districts for state leaders to represent—so should we show surprise when State Assemblymen Joe Caneliamilla (D-Pittsburgh), and Keith Richman (R-Northridge) announced last week that they have prepared a bill known as ACA 28, that they hope will establish a California Citizens Assembly and will allow the average citizen a significantly greater influence in the reform of state government.

Modeled after similar legislation in British Columbia, ACA 28 would enact the Citizens Assembly on Electrical Reform Act of 2006, which would establish a Citizens Assembly to evaluate potential reforms of the laws governing the electoral and campaign process for the Legislature and statewide elected officers.

Low opinion of State governance

“The Legislature’s low public approval ratings reflect citizens’ frustrations with the partisan bickering, inactivity, and stalemate at the highest levels of state government. As a result, the state remains stagnant and unrepresentative,” Assemblyman Richman said. “State government is broken and serious reforms are needed before we can solve the specific problems that threaten our prosperity and quality of life such as education, housing, transportation, and healthcare.”

“Given the Legislature’s dysfunction and partisanship, change must start outside the traditional electoral models and outside the Capitol’s political self-interests. We need to create a movement of civic involvement to help fix California and modernize California’s governance,” Caneliamilla said.

ACA guidelines include:

*Establish a Citizens Assembly to study how California should elect the members of the Legislature and its elected executive officers. The body would evaluate potential reforms of the laws that govern elections and political campaigns in the state. The voters would ultimately decide if a Citizens Assembly should be established.

Broad representation

*Once the Citizens Assembly is approved by the electorate, the Citizens Assembly would be broadly representative of the adult population of California with respect to age, gender, socio-economic status, and geographic distribution based on voter registration.

*A selection task force would be appointed by the Citizens Assembly and would appoint select the members of the Citizens Assembly. The task force would consist of six academic experts, two from the University of California, two from Cal State University and two from private universities in California. The members of the selection task force would serve without compensation.

Downey Studios show off new offices

DOWNEY – More than 90 history buffs and interested persons visited the offices of the new motion pictures studios at Downey Landing last week, part of a visit organized by the Downey Historical Society.

Industrial Realty Group’s Vice President Tom Messmer, who manages Downey Studios, spoke to the group with special emphasis on the four “low truss” buildings that date back to the 1940s and have been turned into spacious offices and ancillary rooms. Messmer described the challenges involved in cleaning up the dust and debris of 70 years of aircraft-related work, especially the ceilings, which were mostly removed so that the architectural “marvel” of the trussed upper levels can be seen at all times.

The architecture and old, historical feel have made the new offices favorites among producers, who are known to take pool and ping-pong







In cases where the pulp is not viable, a root canal must be performed to remove the pulp and replace it.



A 'miracle' on Boyson Street

DOWNEY—There was no mistaking the excitement and the sense of pride in the voices of Police Chief Roy Campos and Fire Chief Mark Sauter at the start of the City Council meeting on Jan. 24 when they presented awards and recognized the contributions of various individuals in their respective departments in the case of Baby Bassam or, as the family calls him, Sam or B-Sam.

The word used to describe what happened to the 2-year-old baby the night of Nov. 23 is that it was a "miracle."

Following is a slightly edited formal account of what transpired, provided by the Downey Fire Department, buttressed by other bits and pieces of information from a variety of sources:

About 30 family members on Nov. 23 had gathered at the host's house in the 8500 block of Boyson St. for a pre-Thanksgiving family get-together. An uncle noticed the boy in the backyard pool, face up and half-submerged, and dove in to retrieve him. Although it is unknown exactly how long the boy was in the cold swimming pool, it was estimated he was in the water 5-8 minutes.

The 911 call was received by the Police Dept Communications Center operators shortly after 9 p.m. They immediately notified their patrol units in the area, and simultaneously called the Fire Department's Communications Center (this took 17 seconds). Fire Department resources were dispatched to the scene.

First to arrive on the scene (in less than 1-1/2 minutes) were the police officers, who began CPR on the young boy after taking him from the arms of the uncle. They then proceeded to the front of the house, all the while applying CPR.

The paramedics from Fire Station I arrived shortly thereafter (two-minute response time) and immediately took over patient care. The Engine Company from Fire Station II arrived less than 30 seconds after the paramedics. Together, the on-scene crews treated the young patient and loaded him onto the waiting paramedic squad. Two of the Engine Company personnel, one of the police officers and both paramedics all worked on the patient as he was being transported to Downey Regional Medical Center (DRMC). One of the other police officers broke traffic for the paramedic squad as it made the transport.

Due to communication problems (poor cell phone coverage) the paramedics were forced to wait until they were well on their way to DRMC before they were able to contact the latter regarding the incident and give them advance warning of their impending arrival. Upon arrival at DRMC, the paramedics transferred care of the patient to the waiting staff, but nevertheless continued to work alongside them.

Police Chaplain Mario Guerra arrived at DRMC after a few minutes. After several more minutes, with ER's Dr. Kare leading the resuscitation efforts on the boy, everybody looked at one another in desperation, apparently resigned to the thought that only prayers could save the boy now.

Miraculously, after over 30 minutes in full arrest, the boy's heart started to beat and a resultant blood pressure was measured!

He was then transferred to the Long Beach Memorial Hospital's (LBMH) pediatric unit later that evening.

After two weeks of apprehension and worry, the family received word that the boy was "fully recovered" from his critical injuries. Although in recovery mode, it is believed that the probability of brain damage in such cases is significant.

In citing the officers and other individuals, as well as the operational agencies, who had a hand in the timely rescue of the boy from certain death and their sustained efforts to revive and shepherd him on the road to recovery, Police Chief Campos and Fire Chief Sauter had only words of thanks and praise for their presence of mind and tremendous teamwork. In the words of the Fire Department, "the skills, efforts, coordination and speed [and quality] of response were incredible."

As reported last week in this paper, for their luminous and much-appreciated work, receiving honors were the following: Distinguished Service Awards to Police Corporal Terry Goeckner and Officer Jose Gomez ("The last time DSA awards were given out was 7 years ago"—Chief Campos), and Letters of Commendation to Police Sgt. Alex Orazabal, Police Corporal Leigh Lacy, Communications Dispatchers Rhonda Foster and Sheri Butler, and Police Chaplain/Deacon Mario Guerra; and Recognitions of Outstanding Service to Fire Captain David Calderwood, Fire Engineer Richard Vos, Firefighter Raul Ochoa, Firefighter/Paramedics Daniel Hurlock and Christopher Bohannon, and Communications Operators Eugenia Brunet and Mary Lou Perez.

In a subsequent Internet message to *The Patriot*, Deacon Guerra had this to say: "What has happened was really a miracle and, while not completely, totally recovered (I am not sure he ever will be), [the boy] has come a long way and his family is just grateful to have him alive." He adds: "Miracles happen because of faith, faith happens because of hope, and hope comes from love. These officers and all concerned displayed love for another human being and their actions were done with tremendous respect for life..."

Blowing Bubbles!
