After brief break, Welch ready for football return

Takes over 2-8 team

Jeff Welch remembers the good times when he was the head coach of Warren High School's football team. During his previous nine-year reign over the Bears' football squad, he led them to seven CIF playoff appearances. His most memorable moment during those nine years was when he coached a group of players who finished a year 2-8 then followed up the next year with the same group of kids finishing with a 9-3 record, taking them to the second round of the CIF playoffs. With all those memories in the rear view mirror, he's ready to make his move back to the head of Warren's football team.

Back to school

Welch resigned as head coach after his 2002 year to pursue a family-owned business. He took control of the Downey Christian School and helped his wife, Sandra, put together a blossoming program.

During his time as an administrator at the school, he helped construct a successful program for preschoolers to fifth grade. He says his greatest achievement at the school during his four years was building it up and watching it grow. According to Welch, when he and his wife took control of the school, there were only 38 kids in attendance. After years of hard work, that attendance jumped from 38 to 150 kids.

Welch credited the success of the school to the great teachers and staff that put in the time to make the school a place for kids to have an opportunity for a great learning experience.

During his years as head coach, Welch built a consistently competitive football program that was always looked upon as a top team in the San Gabriel Valley League. The league contains some of the tougher teams in the CIF division such as Downey High School and Dominguez High School, who are last year's Division III champions.

He cites his success to the great coaching staffs he's had in the past, the wonderful administration that has been there to support him, and most importantly, the commitment from players on his teams and the players' parents.

His philosophy toward the game has nothing to do with trick plays or a West Coast offense. According to Welch, winning games has everything to do with commitment and determination.

"You don't have to be the biggest or fastest, you just have to be committed," Welch said.

Looking ahead

His goals for this year's team follow his philosophy. He always aims to get players in the program determined, committed, loyal, and responsible on the field as well as in the classroom.

"Coach Welch loves the game of football and he always expected us to do our best on and off the field," said Mark Caswell, an ex-player of Welch's. "He always stressed to us how important it was to get an education."

Welch explained how this year he is implementing a study hall session in the morning for all his players. Academics should be a huge part to his players he believes. They were to him when he attended school.

Warren product

Welch attended and graduated from Warren High School before going on to college. While at Warren, he played football as a safety under Coach Randy Drake who is now coaching baseball at Warren. Welch says his inspiration to coach came from Drake.

Welch says Drake helped him as a player and as a coach. According to Welch, Drake helped him understand that being disciplined and committed is what it takes to be successful.

"He's a great guy to go to for advice," Welch said.

After graduating, he went on to Cerritos College where he also played some football. However, before transferring from Cerritos College, he was injured breaking a few ribs and collapsing a lung. It was after that accident that he decided to buckle down and focus completely on school.

After finishing at Cerritos College, he transferred over to Cal State Long Beach where he majored in Health Sciences. He said that he remembers the long nights in the library studying for exams. Welch graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from CSULB and attained his teaching credentials there as well.

Welch then started teaching at Warren where he has been for 17 years. It was now Athletic Director Steve Hill that helped him get into Warren as a Health teacher. According to Welch, Hill gave up some of his Health classes in order to allow him to start teaching.

Earlier in his teaching career, Welch also coached Warren's football team, but not as a head coach. He coached the lower levels before becoming the head coach of the program.

Welch and the rest of his coaching staff are looking forward to a hard fought but successful year. They are holding tryouts on campus looking for players for the Varsity, Junior Varsity, and Frosh teams. They hope to implement their ideology into the team. The goal for this year is to make sure each player works as hard as possible as Welch hopes to pick up from where he left off.



The Auto Club reproduces some of the winning posters and distributes them free of charge to schools throughout Southern California to remind students about traffic safety issues.

SCAG gets grant for growth planning

LOS ANGELES—Through a competitive grant process, the state of California has awarded the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) a \$1.25 million in Regional Blueprint Planning grant to conduct comprehensive regional growth scenario planning. With the state awarding a total of \$5 million in Blueprint grants, the SCAG award was the largest amount provided to a single metropolitan planning organization. The grant will support Southern California Compass, SCAG's ongoing growth visioning effort, to foster consensus by regional leaders, local governments and stakeholders on a preferred growth scenario – or "blueprint" – for a 20-year planning horizon.

The grant will help SCAG work with local communities to deal with future housing, congestion and air quality challenges, driven by population growth, changing demographics, economic and environmental concerns. Prior to the grant award 28 cities, counties, councils of government and other organizations submitted letters to the state indicating their support for the SCAG grant application.

"Awarding the Regional Blueprint Planing grant to SCAG indicates the state's strong support for SCAG's efforts to improve Southern Californians' quality of life with better land use and transportation planning that lead to more effective transportation infrastructure, housing, economic development and environmental quality," stated Toni Young, Port Hueneme City Councilmember and SCAG president.

SCAG recently started enlisting cities and counties in Southern California to become "2 Percent Strategy Demonstration Projects," receiving technical resources and services to develop planning strategies in accordance with SCAG's Compass "2 Percent Strategy" growth visioning initiative. The Compass 2 Percent Strategy is a regional growth visioning concept intended to provide improved mobility, livability, prosperity and sustainability for all Southern Californians by reorienting development around existing and planned transportation infrastructure on just 2 percent of the region's land area. Cities such as Ontario, Rolling Hills Estates and Montclair have successfully gone through SCAG's selection process to undertake "2 Percent Strategy Demonstration Projects" due to their interest in exploring forward-thinking sustainable development solutions that fit local needs and support shared regional values.

The \$1.25 million grant will enable an increasing number of cities and counties to access the Compass services and support being provided by SCAG. In addition to expanding the number of demonstration projects SCAG can accommodate, the Blueprint grant will increase SCAG's educational outreach to local communities about transit-oriented land use development.

SCAG is continuing to receive requests from cities in its region to become 2 Percent Strategy Demonstration Communities. Demonstration projects may include such tactics as infill development, urban enhancements to downtown districts, multi-family housing, mixed-use development, transit oriented development, affordable housing and pedestrian infrastructure. Most demonstration projects will consist of sites that have the potential to make a significant impact on part of the community's physical form. Projects can help local governments explore new development techniques that find creative and beneficial ways to accommodate development. Types of projects could include portions of a general plan update, specific plans, feasibility studies, visioning workshops, redevelopment return on investment analysis, and visualization techniques.

Ask the Contractors Board

Experts answer common home improvement questions

Chair, California Contractors State License Board

Q: My house is 10 years old and I have never replaced the roof. I know roofs last for a long time, but how long can I really rely on my roof to last, and continue to adequately withstand the winter weather?

A: The age of your roof is usually the major factor in determining when to replace it. The average life of a roof is 15 to 20 years, which means your roof is probably not in need of being replaced, assuming it was properly installed to begin with. Most roofs last many years if properly installed and often can be repaired rather than replaced.

You must evaluate the condition of your roof to determine if it needs any repairs or work. For example, if there are small isolated leaks, you can simply have them repaired. If the damage is more extensive, you may consider getting bids from licensed contractors to actually replace the roof. Before making any roofing repairs or hiring someone to replace your old or damaged roof, you should visit the CSLB web site at www.cslb.ca.gov to find a licensed roofing contractor and verify their license status. You can also find publications such as What You should Know Before You Hire a Contractor, Ten Tips for Making Sure Your Contractor Measures Up, and Tips for Hiring a Roofing Contractor.

Q: I'm not satisfied with the job my contractor did while fixing damage to my house from a recent storm. He finished the job a week ago, what should I do? Is he required to fix the work he's already done, if I'm unhappy with the outcome?

A: Call your contractor and talk to him about the concerns you have. Many times they will work with you and make the corrections willingly. However, if this is not the case, you should do the following:

*Notify the contractor in writing of your dissatisfaction of work done *Gather all papers relating to your home repair project, including contracts, change order(s) and any cancelled checks

*Take photographs of the problem(s)

*Download or order a free copy of "A Consumer's Guide to Filing Construction Complaints" as well as the actual complaint form, via the CSLB website at www.cslb.ca.gov

*File a complaint with the CSLB

If your complaint falls within the Board's jurisdiction, the Mediation Center may help resolve the matter. However, the case could also wind up in the Board's Investigation Center if further investigation is needed. You may also take your contractor to Small Claims Court.

Q:Does every contractor need to carry commercial general liability insurance? If so, how can I check to see if the contractor I'm hiring has it?

A: No, contractors are not required to carry general liability insurance. However, the CSLB recommends that you hire one who does. Home improvement contractors are required to tell you whether they are covered or not. This insurance protects you against third-party bodily injury and accidental property damage. However, it doesn't necessarily cover the contractor's work. When making the decision to hire a contractor, you should determine in advance what the risks are to your family and your home when home improvements are performed. Then decide if you will require your contractor to carry liability insurance. To check your contractor's general liability insurance, ask for the contact information of their liability insurance carrier. Then call the insurance company to ensure the contractor's insurance will cover the work being done on your home.
