# Scratching for a chance at millions

**DOWNEY** – Jonathan Fox likes to scratch.

Ask him, he'll admit it. Ever since he turned 18 three years ago, he's been a scratcher. It's gotten to the point where he cannot go one day without one good long scratch.

Aaaah!

But it's not like it sounds. Jonathan plays the lottery, more specifically, the Scratchers. He doesn't play for the "big one," although that would be nice, but smaller, more realistic payouts that help subsidize his salary as a production designer for the *Downey Patriot*. And for the most part, he's done alright: he claims that in three years of legal gambling, he's actually ahead.

But still, when he scraped at the Big Spin Scratcher last December and learned he had won an opportunity to win up to \$3 million on the Big Spin television show, he was shocked. So shocked, he says, he managed to get out only two words, none of which were suitable for this family newspaper.

Fox visited the Big Spin Show two weeks ago and while he didn't come away with the \$3 million jackpot, he did win \$2,000.

The show is set to air tomorrow, March 18, at 7 p.m. on Channel 9. Fox bought his winning ticket shortly before Christmas at the Sunrise

Liquor store on the corner of Imperial Hwy. and Brookshire Ave. It was part of his daily habit of buying one lottery ticket, usually a \$1 ticket, but sometimes a \$5 Scratcher. On this day, he purchased a Big Spin ticket, along with a Caprice fruit drink. (It was an unusually warm December, if you can remember.)

The Big Spin Scratcher is played by scraping away at six potential prizes. Match three like prizes, which range from \$3 to a chance to go on TV and become a multi-millionaire, and you win that prize.

Fox stepped outside, grabbed a penny and got to scratching.

Scratch one: \$10 (a decent start)

Scratch two: TV SHOW (now we're talking) Scratch three: \$3 (things are not looking so good)

Scratch four: TV SHOW (this happens a lot, a tease like this)

Scratch five: \$50 (at this point, Fox's only chance of winning anything is for the final prize to read "TV SHOW" but what are the chances of... Scratch six: TV SHOW

Bingo! Fox was on his way towards 15 minutes of fame and possibly a lot of money. Lots of thoughts went through his head; strangely, the whole "mansionization" talk sweeping the city suddenly interested him. He envisioned a new Dodge Magnum replacing his rickety Toyota Camry and a new computer that didn't come from a Dell outlet store. And the video games. Oh, the video games! Fox was like a modern-day Charlie & the Chocolate Factory.

But then Fox came back to reality. He knew the odds of hitting the jackpot were slim; heck, all he had won was the chance *for a chance* at the

# Healing Field opens in Downey April 19

**DOWNEY**—The Healing Field, a dramatic display of more than a thousand American flags to symbolize the numerous deaths from child abuse of children across the nation in the last year, will for the second year be presented by the Exchange Club Family Support Center at East Middle School (corner of Woodruff and Florence Aves.).

An additional 20 flags will be flown on the field to represent the children who have died in Downey and surrounding cities in the past five years.

The tribute to America's lost children, and what is in fact a jarring reality check on the prevalence of child abuse in the United States, is scheduled in Downey from April 19 through April 22. April is Child Abuse Prevention Month.

The Exchange Club Center welcomes volunteers as they play a huge part in the four-day affair. At the same time, the Center encourages members of the community to sponsor a flag and take a part of the Healing Field home.

Opening ceremony is at 3 p.m. Wednesday, April 19. The field will be open from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. April 19-22, to allow everyone to experience the Healing Field. Information booths will be open until 9 p.m.

At 3 p.m. Saturday, April 22, disassembly will begin, and flags may be picked up between 2 and 5 p.m.

# City moves to limit mega-homes

**DOWNEY**—The City Council, after another public hearing on how to control the 'mansionization' of one family homes, which are being bought, then rebuilt to the maximum structure allowable under the present code—usually a two story mega-giant with less than aesthetic appeal, has introduced an ordinance aimed at ending the abuse.

The action wraps up more than a year of debate over how to control the monster mansions, which have already destroyed the beauty and balance of neighborhoods both here and in other areas such as the San Fernando Valley where residents have rallied to resist the mega-giants.

The cost of the new structures is made practical by the ownership by several families which then share the property, often causing a community problem in terms of parking.

The City hired an expert consultant, Mark Brodeur of Downey Solutions to do a study. After lengthy public input at two public meetings, he advised a revised ordinance that was hoped would settle such issues as providing a grandfather clause on existing limits on footprints, whether to consider garage areas and required parking areas as part of the ratio of first floor to second floor area, and the like.

The public hearing Tuesday addressed these and related issues, and resulted in a further finetuning of the proposed ordinance, with a deletion of a word or two here and there, and otherwise sharpening definitions and provisions such as:

\*The garage areas and required parking areas will form part of the FAR (floor area) ratio, between the first and second floors;

\*The 0.65 and 0.70 FAR ratios will apply to R-1/5,000-8,500 sq. ft. houses, and to more than R-1/10,000 sq. ft. houses, respectively:

\*The ceiling height of houses will be maintained at 30'.

The majority of the some 17 citizens who spoke agreed that much progress "in the right direction" has been accomplished in hammering out the revised ordinance, and that given close application of future design guidelines set by a designated Design Review Board—always striving to maintain the distinctive "character and charm" of neighborhoods—the outlook for Downey looks good.

The proposed ordinance goes back to Council for adoption in the next Council meeting.

In accordance with the State Environmental Quality Act, staff prepared a declaration of negative environmental impact.

In other action at Tuesday's meeting the Council:

\*Acting as the Community Development Commission, authorized a request for proposals for a new security service for City Parking Structure.

\*Proclaimed March as Mental Retardation Awareness Month.

\*Certified appointment to the newly-formed Art in Public Places Advisory Committee of Vivian Dirkee, District 1; Katherine Bode, District 2; Harold Tseklenis, District 3; Robert Goldstein, District 4; and George Redfox, District 5.

\*Presented a certificate of appointment naming Luis Marquez to the Cable TV Advisory Committee, from District 1.

\*Approved a cash contract for \$41,921 for a storage tank -removal at 9255 Imperial Highway, and awarded the job to Jem Industries.

\*Approved an agreement with Siemens Energy and Automation for the development of advanced software for a traffic management system, maintenance and support.

\*Approved the Fourth Amended and Restated Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement with the Southeast Los Angeles County Workforce Investment Board.

\*Referred to the Planning Commission initiation of a code amendment

to allow residential properties within the single family and two-family residential zones that have an existing one-car garage to provide additional off-street parking by increasing the allowable driveway width.

\*Approved the purchase of new radios for the Fire Department ambulance and appropriated \$8,700 to pay for them.

The Downey Police, City of Downey and the Downey Unified School District are recipients of funds raised by GOOD.





# Attempted robbery thwarted, man shot

**DOWNEY**—One man was listed in serious condition from bullet wounds suffered in an exchange of gunfire during an attempted robbery at First Class Auto, 8856 Rosecrans Ave., and three others linked to the holdup effort, that occurred about 11:28 a.m. Thursday, March 9 are being

Witnesses told police three males and a female entered the business. One of the men, identified only as Salvador Ramos, approached a sales clerk and brandished a gun. The clerk, fearing for his life, also produced a gun and fired at the suspect. The store owner also produced a gun and fired. A second suspect produced a handgun and began firing. The second suspect and man and woman then exited the store and fled the scene in a red pickup or SUV.

Ramos was found on the floor of the store suffering from multiple gunshot wounds and was listed in serious condition at a local hospital. He faces charges of attempted murder.

The other suspects are described as a male Hispanic 25-30 years of age, 6 foot 3 inches, 230 pounds, wearing jeans, a pullover shirt and with a large medical bandage on his neck. The female suspect is Hispanic, 24-25, medium height and weight, wearing jeans and a sweater. The fourth suspect is described only as a male Hispanic.



# SCAG presses priorities with state legislators

**SACRAMENTO**—Local elected leaders representing the six-county Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) region met March 8 with state legislators to advocate for high priority Southern California transportation improvements in the pending state infrastructure bond measures. In addition to relieving congestion and improving air quality, the SCAG delegation argued that investments in the region's infrastructure would yield significant economic returns to the state in the short-

At the request of the state's Business, Transportation and Housing Department, SCAG submitted a consensus Goods Movement Plan last year to help the state identify Southern California's transportation and infrastructure priorities. The state infrastructure bond measures are expected to reflect many of the priorities in this plan. SCAG presented seven infrastructure priority issues to legislators:

1) Project Funding – Ensure the equitable distribution of highway and transit funds, with priority given to projects providing environmental mitigation. Funding for goods movement should be assessed based on freight volume and performance.

2) Expedited Project Delivery - Allow design-build and designsequencing with early assistance to promote private sector participation and conduct environmental reviews.

3) Prop. 42 Funds – Ensure that gasoline tax revenues are fully protected behind a full firewall from diversions to non-transportation spending.

4) Financing Tools - Employ a business plan model to create transportation systems and implement different financing schemes that promote public-private partnerships.

5) Transit/Rail – Provide funding for high-speed rail to connect regional airports and give priority to transit-oriented and mixed-use housing.

6) Housing – Provide priority funding to areas meeting fair share housing under the Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) program, allocate funds based on regional planning allocation formula and promote 20-year housing planning.

7) CEQA Efficiency - Promote and encourage implementation of regional planning initiatives and protect open space and other environmental resources.

"California's economy is largely based on our ability to move goods," said Toni Young, Port Hueneme City Councilmember and President of SCAG. "The state must support efforts to improve our transportation systems and infrastructure or our economy will come to a halt."

More than 40 percent of the nation's trade volume uses Southern California's ports, but the current transportation infrastructure required to deliver cargo is not adequate to handle anticipated trade growth without increasing traffic congestion, air pollution and other detrimental impacts on the local communities. Key transportation infrastructure investments are needed to improve the state's goods movement system or it may lose billions of dollars in future economic growth. With federal funding at an inadequate level to accommodate the region's trade growth, state funding in is a critical financing mechanism.

In addition to SCAG president Young, the SCAG Southern California delegation included Calabasas Mayor Dennis Washburn; San Gabriel Councilmember Harry Baldwin; SCAG Executive Director Mark Pisano; David Ryu, staff for Los Angeles County Supervisor; and SCAG First Vice President Yvonne B. Burke.

The group met with a number of the state legislators and transportation leaders, including Sen. Alan Lowenthal, Chair, Transportation Committee,


So far this year, the Vikings have a record of 4-3 after playing in the Loara Tournament. They beat Artesia twice and Katella and El Modena once a piece.



## **Ask the Contractors Board**

By Bert Sandman,

Q: I am considering hiring a contractor who told me he is "selfinsured" for general liability insurance. What does that mean, and is it safe to hire him?

A: If a contractor is "self-insured" he or she has made a decision to be responsible for losses normally covered by insurance. Before hiring, ask vourself "if something went wrong, would this contractor be able to cover the costs?" If the answer is "no," then find a contractor with general liability insurance through an established company. While licensed contractors are not required to carry general liability insurance they must include information in your written contract about whether or not they carry general liability insurance and that it will protect against third-party bodily injury and property damage.

If uninsured the contractor should be able to explain how they could cover losses that would ordinarily be covered by insurance. Because the CSLB recommends contractors have general liability insurance, most carry it. But, if your contractor damages your property and doesn't carry general liability insurance you or your insurance policy could end up paying for damages. Be sure to visit the CSLB website at www.cslb.ca.gov to check the license of a contractor before signing any contract.

**Q:** I have identified asbestos in my home. It's an older home, so I am not surprised, but I need to get it removed. Where do I start?

A: Asbestos is a naturally occurring mineral fiber that has been used extensively in construction and many other industries. Nearly every building contains asbestos in some form. It has been widely used because of its special properties. For example, asbestos is very resistant to destruction by heat or chemicals, and its fibers are extremely durable. These characteristics led to its use in wall insulation; paint; sprayed- or troweled-on surfacing materials; ceiling and flooring materials; pipe, boiler, and duct insulations; cement filler; and a variety of other products.

Because asbestos is a health hazard, it is important to carefully select a licensed contractor to remove it. Before choosing a contractor, get bids from at least three licensed contractors to perform the job. Request work plans detailing the schedule each would follow while performing the work. Then, visit the CSLB website to confirm the contractor has a certification to remove asbestos.

Next, make sure the contractor has all the appropriate tools, training, and licensing and certification necessary to comply with the law and to protect you from unnecessary exposure to asbestos fibers. Finally, call Cal/OSHA to make sure the contractor has current registration as an asbestos abatement contractor. Other important requirements your asbestos removal contractor should meet include:

\*Copies of notification materials for the EPA and Cal/OSHA


- \*Job site log-in sheets
- \*Monitoring reports for air and personnel
- \*Accident reports
- \*Hauling and disposal information and permits
- \*A final air monitoring report



This useful publication outlines information about the specialized skills and equipment required for the services of registered and certified asbestos abatement contractors.

**Q:** I know I am encouraged to verify a contractor's license through the CSLB before they start work on my house, but I am also interested in finding out about suspensions or other legal actions taken against them. Are they required to disclose this information to me, just as they do their license status?

A: A contractor who has had his or her license suspended or revoked due to disciplinary action two or more times within an eight-year period must notify consumers prior to entering into a home improvement contract for a residential property. This notice is required whether or not the revocation or suspension was stayed. This notice must include information on any citation, license suspension or license revocation during the last four years, resulting from any violation by the contractor or legal action taken against the contractor. Complaint information about a license is disclosed after the complaint has been fully investigated and has been referred for legal action.
