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City hires full-time attorney

■ John Funk, a 1987 Downey High grad, will become Downey's new city attorney.

hire John Funk as its new city attorney, effective next Monday, to formally announce he will run Sept. 18.

Funk will earn a salary of in the March primary. \$238,442 per year, plus a \$300 auto allowance per month and other fringe benefits.

His employment agreement includes a lump sum payment of nine months base salary and medical benefits for termination without cause.

Currently serving as the chief assistant city attorney for the City of Santa Ana, Funk brings with him 24 years of legal experience working for different municipal

The Downey City Council approved Funk's employment at their meeting Tuesday.

Mayor Pro Tem Mario Trujillo publicly welcomed Funk, noting that he was "homegrown."

"He actually grew up in this city, and this is a big moment for our city to have you come back and represent us now as our city attorney," said Trujillo.

Funk graduated from Downey High School in 1987.

The city attorney position is one of the last holes that need to be filled at the city's administrative level, following the departure of Yvette Abich Garcia in 2022.

Since her resignation, the city has operated with an interim attorney.

Downey Police to comply with L.A. County's new bail system

■ Nearly all suspects arrested for non-violent offenses will be immediately released after they are cited or booked, effective Oct. 1.

DOWNEY - The Downey Police Department will comply with L.A. County's new set of bail schedules set to begin Oct. 1, resulting in arrestees being almost immediately released for nonviolent offenses.

Under the new policy, police officers must cite-and-release or book-and-release suspects in nearly all theft offenses, vehicle code violations, and crimes against property such as petty theft and vandalism.

Instead of assigning money bail amounts to non-violent felonies and misdemeanors, a majority of suspects will now be released at the location of the arrest or booked in jail and then released on their own recognizance with a citation for a future

Offenses involving guns, sexual battery, crimes against children or elders, and contact with minors with intent to commit a sexual offense will be subject to a magistrate review. Magistrates will consider the crime and determine whether the suspect should

be released with no conditions or determine the least restrictive, non-financial conditions intended to address whether the suspect is likely to return to court.

All offenses in the magistrate review category are designated as zero bail offenses.

As an example, a person arrested for false imprisonment under current protocols would be held on \$50,000 bail. Under the new system, the suspect would be eligible to be booked and immediately released.

Los Angeles County District Attorney George Gascon introduced the new bail system and it was upheld by Los Angeles County Superior Court on July 18.

"This represents a significant change in protocols for all law enforcement agencies in Los Angeles County," the Downey Police Department said in a news release. "The Downey Police Department remains committed to the safety and security of our community. We will continue to work within the processes set forth by the Superior Court of Los Angeles County, and as a profession,

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L.A. County taking regional approach to stop illegal street takeovers

■ Officials call street takeovers a growing problem in Southern California.

LOS ANGELES Angeles County Board Supervisors unanimously directed a host of county and other agencies to hold a community symposium on street takeovers.

The motion by Supervisor Holly Mitchell calls on the county Department of Public Health, Department of Public Works, Sheriff's Department, the California Highway Patrol, the District Attorney's Office and other organizations to take part in a meeting no later than Feb. 28, 2024, then report back to the board with recommendations for addressing the issue.

Mitchell said the symposium should be "a forum to gather information and (develop) a comprehensive plan to address the issue."

She said participants should review preventive measures that have been tried in the past to determine which ones worked and which didn't, and what new steps can be taken.

She said there "seems to be an utter disregard by the organizers, the participants, those who film it ... for the safety of the surrounding community and their very own

a growing problem across the Viaduct opened near downtown facility in the harbor area. Los Angeles, leading to an almost immediate surge of dangerous stunt driving and takeovers on the bridge.

During the board meeting, several relatives of people who have died as a result of street racing spoke tearfully in support of the motion, with one saying, "My family will never, ever, ever be the same."

"It needs to stop," she added.

Mitchell's motion suggests participants in the symposium providing secure permanent closed tracks, separate from public streets, for street performance activities in communities most impacted by illegal street racing and street takeovers.

Southland, highlighted in July supported such a concept, saying 2022 when the Sixth Street there used to be a legal racing

> "It was a regular safe place for racing," Hahn said. "And I don't know if there's a correlation between no safe space for that to happen versus this need to continually be illegal and take over intersections.

Mitchell's motion suggested infrastructure improvements to curb street takeovers, along with an examination of whether land use encourages street takeovers.

Supervisors consider proposals such as unanimously in support of the symposium.

> "Unfortunately, we may see more and more of this happen unless some action is taken." Supervisor Hilda Solis said.

The county's existing street

racing ordinance, which makes it a misdemeanor to be a spectator at such events, includes penalties including fines of up to \$500, imprisonment of no more than six months in jail, or both.

The motion calls participants at the symposium to recommend possible changes to the ordinance, including potential increases in penalties, and whether penalties can be assessed against street racing spectators who post on social media. The possibility of working with social media partners to remove posts that include such illegal activity from their platforms would also be discussed.

Though dangerous street Supervisor Janice Hahn takeovers and sideshows can lead to deadly shootings, fatal car crashes and property damage, the county's ability to address the issues is limited in unincorporated areas, according to the motion. The California Highway Patrol enforces speed limits and the sheriff's department breaks up large gatherings, while the Department of Public Works deploys infrastructure solutions.

> On Sept. 7, 2022, the county Civilian Oversight Commission conducted a virtual conference with law enforcement, local experts and nonprofit organizations to discuss the dangers of illegal street racing and reckless driving. Though the resulting report was not adopted by the COC, it addressed the need for a plan to address illegal street takeovers with a comprehensive approach that goes beyond punishment.




Fair housing meeting at library

After the three driest years on record, the storms of 2023 brought welcomed moisture to the region. Through our partnership with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works, we have captured around 57 billion gallons (176,000 acre-feet) of stormwater. That is a year's worth of water for about 350,000 families of four! This stormwater is diverted from the San Gabriel and Rio Hondo Rivers into the Montebello Forebay spreading grounds. The spreading grounds are large ponds that allow water to soak into the ground, where it can be stored for future use.

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Paging Dr. Frischer...

Every day I listen to complaints from patients about how difficult it is to



get a good night's sleep. All of us have had times when sleep is a challenge. Most sleep medications

are fraught with complications, including addiction, dependency, and the simple fact that, over time, they just stop working.

Rather than putting up with being sleep deprived, or depending on meds, let me encourage lifestyle changes. Here are some of my favorite tips for how to get that satisfying night of sleep:

· Have a consistent sleep schedule. This helps to establish our circadian rhythms. Do note that this includes weekends as well.

· Increase your bright

light exposure during the day. Bright light affects the brain, body, and hormones, helping us to stay awake during the daytime. It also improves daytime energy, which then helps us fall asleep at night. (When daily sunlight is not possible, some people mimic it with a light therapy lamp.)

Reduce your light exposure in the evening. Blue light, which comes from electronic devices like some TVs, smartphones, and computers, is the most problematic. Consider turning off the TV and other electronic devices two hours before bedtime.

· Cut back on daytime naps. Naps tend to affect nighttime sleep, but of course, if short daytime power naps work for you, and don't affect your sleep at night, then by all means, carry on.

· **Avoid alcohol**. Many

of my patients believe that alcohol relaxes them and helps them sleep. Unfortunately, even modest amounts of alcohol at night can interfere with sleep by increasing sleep apnea symptoms, worsening snoring, and launching poor sleep patterns. It alters the production of melatonin, which plays a key role in our circadian rhythms. It can increase feelings of panic, anxiety and depression, which will certainly keep us awake at night.

• Cut out caffeine
after lunch. Caffeine has
a number of benefits,
as most Americans are
aware. It can bring about
better focus, more energy,
and improved sports
performance. However, it is
a nervous system stimulant.
Caffeine levels can stay
elevated for eight hours
after consumption. If you are
craving coffee later in the
day, let me suggest sticking
with decaf.

· Optimize your sleep environment. This includes controlling temperature, noise, external lights, and furniture arrangement. Our mattress and pillow can have an enormous effect on back pain, shoulder pain, back stiffness, and sleep quality. Consider whether it is time for a replacement, and test before buying.

• Don't eat late. Studies show that eating a large meal or snacks can affect sleep and sleep hormone levels. (Note that a small bedtime snack for diabetics is often necessary.)

· Relax and clear your mind. Various techniques for relaxation before bed have been shown to help. These include taking a bath, listening to music, reading a book, massage, meditating,

deep breathing, and visualization.

• Exercise regularly. Exercise is one of the very best ways to improve sleep and health. Note that while daily exercise is key, don't plan it too close to bedtime.

Be sure to rule out any underlying health condition. Sleep apnea, for example, is a sleep disorder which causes inconsistent and interrupted breathing. Urinary frequency keeps many up at night. Any condition that causes pain will disrupt sleep.

And yes, some supplements and natural remedies can help. Melatonin is a key sleep hormone that helps our brain relax and go to sleep. It should not cause withdrawal symptoms or next day hangover effects. Other popular sleep aids include ginkgo biloba, glycine, valerian root, magnesium, chamomile and lavender.

Let's improve our health and well-being by making sleep a top priority.

FDA approves updated Covid-19 vaccines

■ Updated vaccinations are expected to become available in the coming days.

The Food and Drug Administration on Monday approved updated Covid vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna, putting the shots on track to reach Americans within days as U.S. hospitalizations from the virus rise.

The new vaccines, which target the omicron variant XBB.1.5, are approved for people 12 and older and are authorized under emergency use for children 6 months through 11 years old, according to an FDA release.

The FDA did not announce a decision Monday on an updated Covid shot from Novavax, but the company said in a statement that the agency is still reviewing its vaccine.

Novavax's vaccine uses protein-based technology, a decades-old method deployed in routine vaccinations against hepatitis B and shingles. Meanwhile, Pfizer's and Moderna's shots use messenger RNA, which teaches cells how

to make proteins that trigger an immune response against Covid.

The upcoming arrival of updated vaccines offers some reassurance to Americans as the nation sees an increase in Covid cases and hospitalizations.

While the shots do not target the variants dominant now, the vaccine makers have said the shots will still offer protection against those strains as children return to school and the weather gets cooler.

"We expect this season's vaccine to be available in the coming days, pending recommendation from public health authorities," Pfizer CEO Albert Bourla said in a release following the approval.

Hospitalizations have increased for seven straight weeks, and rose more than 15% for the week ending Aug. 26, to 17,418, according to the latest data from the CDC. But that number remains below the surge the nation saw in summer 2022, when hospitalizations climbed to more than 40,000.

The uptick is fueled by newer — but closely related to XBB.1.5 — strains of the virus such as EG.5, or Eris. That omicron strain accounted for 21.5% of all cases as of Sept. 2, according to the CDC.

Meanwhile, XBB.1.5 is declining in the U.S., the CDC said.



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
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


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Frida Kahlo subject of **Cerritos Library lecture**

The trailblazer crafted her own unique fashion style, by combining the Mexican tunic-like garment huipil with jewelry and garments from India and China, and merged elements of popular poetry, sayings and music into her visual art.

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Why Trump can run for President

The constitution does not disqualify Donald Trump from running for office.

Last week, six Colorado voters and the Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington (CREW) filed a lawsuit in state court to prevent former President Donald Trump from running for the presidency next year. They argue that the Constitution's Disqualification Clause in the 14th Amendment, barring those who've engaged in insurrection from holding office, prohibits Trump from appearing on the ballot. (Since the filing, Trump has asked to move the CREW challenge to federal court.)

It is understandable that Trump's critics have mounted aggressive efforts to derail the former president's candidacy. As his two impeachments and four indictments indicate, Trump is manifestly unfit to hold public office and should not become president again. (Trump denies all the charges.) But claims that the former president should be barred from running by the Disqualification Clause are misguided, and the arguments for disqualification would have troubling implications for other cases.

The Disqualification Clause was adopted as Section 3 of the 14th Amendment in 1868, and its primary purpose was to address a serious problem with elections in the Southern states. After the Civil War, Southern states sent to Congress men who had violated their earlier oaths to support the Constitution by serving in leadership roles in the Confederacy. Accordingly, Section 3 prohibits individuals from holding office if they previously took an oath to support the Constitution and then "engaged in insurrection or rebellion against" the United States.

The text of the ban is written in general terms, so it could apply to insurrections or rebellions other than the Civil War. But the drafters of the ban did not provide a definition of "insurrection," and a key question today is what the word should apply to. Does the insurrection have to be as serious as the Confederacy's secession, rebellion and civil war? Or should we interpret insurrection more broadly, such as playing a role in the violent assault on the US Capitol on January 6, 2021?

Those who would disqualify Trump certainly believe in an expansive application – but it's one that goes too far.

According to CREW, we should understand insurrection as "an assemblage of persons" who use "force" while "acting with the purpose to oppose the continuing authority of the United States Constitution." To arrive at this meaning, the organization draws on criminal insurrection statutes, academic analyses and court decisions, including that of a New Mexico trial court that last year disqualified a county commissioner because of his role in the January 6 attack on the Capitol.

The problem with the CREW definition is that it would not only apply to Trump and others who tried to overturn the 2020 election with the conduct that culminated in the January 6 violence but also to others who use force for any reason to resist governmental authority. For instance, as proponents of a definition of insurrection essentially the same as CREW's acknowledge, abolitionists who tried to prevent fugitive slaves from being returned to their owners in the years before slaves were emancipated would qualify as insurrectionists.

In fact, in defining insurrection, CREW and the New Mexico trial court drew on an 1894 criminal case involving the prosecution of labor activists, including labor leader Eugene Debs, for their participation in a nationwide strike of railroad workers. The CREW definition also would have presumably applied to those who protested our country's involvement in the Vietnam War by using force of any kind to disrupt the military draft.

The broad interpretations of the Disqualification Clause extend too far in another way – in terms of who can be ensnared by it. According to the CREW lawsuit and the New Mexico trial court, one need not personally use force to fall under the Disqualification Clause. Rather, one can engage in insurrection with "words in furtherance of the insurrection," including words that "provoke, encourage or command others to engage in insurrectionary conduct." This view of insurrection could in theory apply to an elected official who speaks sympathetically at a protest against an unjust law were the protest to unexpectedly turn violent.

A narrow definition of insurrection makes much more sense. We should not disqualify those who strongly protest unjust laws, nor should we disenfranchise the voters who want to re-elect officials who fight against unjust laws. Indeed, such candidates may be especially desirable as elected officials. Moreover, elected officials should not have to worry whether their support for those protesters would trigger their own disqualification from running for re-election.

At the same time, we don't need to worry that a narrow definition might not go far enough for those who have

undeniably engaged in insurrection. There are additional ways to prevent these people from holding public office, such as impeachment and prosecution for other crimes.

Courts have recently imposed sentences of 22 and 18 years on leaders of the Proud Boys and Oath Keepers, respectively, who played key roles in the January 6 violence. While Trump himself could still run for the presidency even if convicted in one or more of his four prosecutions, it would be very difficult to wage an effective campaign from a prison cell.

It is essential that Trump not escape accountability for his efforts to overturn the

2020 presidential election. But some of the many civil and criminal cases against him are the best way to do so. In responding to efforts to thwart Trump's re-election, courts should not interpret the Constitution in ways that would disqualify for public service people who try to block the implementation of unjust laws.

Kevin McCarthy caved

House Speaker Kevin McCarthy caved to the far right of his party in giving the green light to an effort to impeach President Joe Biden, authorizing three House committees to begin investigations of Biden's family finances. On Tuesday, the speaker told reporters gathered outside his office at the Capitol, "Today, I am directing our House committees to open a formal impeachment inquiry into President Joe Biden."

In fact, Republicans have been digging into their finances for some time, justifying it as assisting in the work of legislating. The Oversight Committee examined more than 12,000 pages of subpoenaed bank records, and more than 2,000 pages of suspicious activity reports as well as interviewing witnesses, including two of Hunter Biden's former business associates, and found no evidence of any payments to the president.

Until now, McCarthy has taken the position, shared by many other House and Senate Republicans, that before undertaking an impeachment inquiry, the full House should vote, consistent with past practice, to move forward. But the full House is divided: Not everyone

agrees with Reps. Marjorie Taylor Greene and Matt Gaetz and the other leaders of the impeachment effort. Rep. Ken Buck, a conservative Republican, criticized Greene for tying impeachment to the government spending bill, calling her timeline "absurd," and saying, sensibly enough, that "the time for impeachment is the time when there's evidence linking President Biden — if there's evidence linking President Biden to a high crime or misdemeanor. That doesn't exist right now," on MSNBC's "Inside with Jen Psaki."

I agree with Ken Buck. What's more, I agree with Sen. Marco Rubio, the very conservative Florida Republican, who argues that impeaching a sitting president "should generally be avoided for the interest of the country."

"It can't become routine ... There are countries like Peru that routinely now impeach whoever the president is, and it's become almost a national sport ... My big fear remains that at some point you trivialize this, you make it routine. Suddenly it becomes a weapon or a tool routinely used by a political party against someone from the other party in power," he said. It's a measure of how far right McCarthy has gone that I find myself in agreement with Marco Rubio.

Of course, these same arguments were made by Republicans when it was the Democrats who were impeaching President Donald Trump, and by Democrats when it was Republicans who were impeaching President Bill Clinton. Is what's good for the goose good for the gander? Maybe, but the analogy falls apart to the extent that Trump's misdeeds have in fact led to indictment for high crimes, whereas in Clinton's case, the failed impeachment effort led to Democrats picking up seats in the 1998 midterm election, which may be the closest analogue to this effort.

Indeed, even if the House Republicans were united, which they aren't, impeachment doesn't stand a chance in the Senate and could easily be viewed by voters as a waste of valuable time. According to Sen. John Cornyn, a member of the Republican leadership team in the Senate, "It really comes to how do you prioritize your time? I don't know of anybody who believes (Senate Majority Leader) Chuck Schumer will take it up and actually have a trial and convict a sitting president. ... Members of the House don't really care what I think. All I can tell you, it's unlikely to be successful in the Senate. Rather than doing something they know is unlikely to end the way they would like, maybe they want to emphasize other things." Other things like the economy and the border, which voters do care about, and not inside politics, which is what is driving Kevin McCarthy further and further to the right, to the point that he may be driving his party out of the mainstream and into the hands of Democrats.


The city needs to crack down on this situation. I'd say before it gets too late, but it seems too late already.



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Whittier teachers travel to Poland for living history experience

WHITTIER — Three
Whittier Union history teachers
received an up-close look
at living history when they
participated in the Auschwitz
Legacy Program, a one-week trip
to Poland in July that included
tours of the infamous AuschwitzBirkenau concentration camp
and the Warsaw Ghetto, as well
as access to archives of letters
and personal items saved from
Holocaust victims during World
War II.

John Bellanti of Whittier
High School, Gena Arriola-Salas
of Pioneer High School and
MaryAnn Fajardo of Frontier
High School joined a group of
30 educators and Holocaust
researchers from across the
United States as part of an
education initiative created
by the Auschwitz-Birkenau
Memorial Foundation to keep the
memories of victims alive.

For Bellanti, Arriola-Salas and Fajardo – who all include WWII and the Holocaust in their lesson plans and have worked extensively with entities such as the Los Angeles Holocaust Museum, the United States Holocaust Museum and the Anti-Defamation League – the trip was educational. Each teacher discovered new information, such as the existence of the Ringelblum Archives, a collection of letters written by Jewish families in Warsaw that were hidden in milk cans and are now preserved at the Jewish Historical Institute in Warsaw.

During the trip, the three teachers found themselves in areas and locales where Holocaust victims arrived, slept and washed up. At the Auschwitz Museum, seeing handprints on the walls and unused canisters of Zyclon B provided images that the teachers said will stay with them forever.

"I've been to Pearl Harbor and Normandy. I wanted to put myself in these situations because I want to be able to explain to my students the history as best as I can," Bellanti said. "But this one will really be hard. It will be hard to teach these lessons without getting

emotional. But you have to tell them, you have to teach the history."

For Arriola-Salas, the tours were essential for her roles as a historian and teacher, but once inside – where she could see for herself how meticulous planning and technological innovation conspired to perpetrate horrendous crimes – she said she wondered if it was right to be able to view this history at all.

"I felt torn. I've waited all these years to finally come to the Auschwitz Museum, then I felt like, is it O.K. to be here?" Arriola-Salas said. "It's not easy to describe what you see to those who have not seen it themselves. But that's the goal of the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial Foundation, to preserve what's there, not to rebuild or reinterpret. They are an amazing organization that wants to ensure students are learning these lessons."

The teachers toured the Warsaw Ghetto extensively, an area where more than 450,000 Polish Jews were held before many were taken to concentration camps. The encampment was leveled by Nazis during the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising in 1943.

The tour group viewed the remaining segment of the iron wall and remnants of the ghetto, which is now mostly apartment complexes. The group also spent a day in Krakow touring centuries-old synagogues that were spared destruction by the Nazis.

"I was humbled by the trip, both personally and professionally," said Fajardo, who traveled to Berlin in 2019 to meet with Holocaust survivors. "Visiting the camp was impactful. Just to see what you have been teaching for so many years and see it firsthand. It's hard to put into words."

As Bellanti, Arriola-Salas and

Fajardo work to incorporate their experiences in their classroom lessons on WWII, they agree that the best possible outcome of their overseas trip is to teach their students to be good, kind and empathetic human beings who will stand up to those who employ hateful speech and seek to eliminate our personal freedoms.

One possible outcome of the trip abroad is a joint effort by Whittier Union and the Foundation to arrange for a virtual tour of Auschwitz-Birkenau for Whittier Union's Advanced Placement European History or World Civilization students, which aims to give students a better perspective of the history contained within its walls.

The trip also afforded
Bellanti, Arriola-Salas and
Fajardo the opportunity to
meet with representatives of
Holocaust museums in Los
Angeles, Colorado and Michigan,
which could lead to a series
of professional development
seminars with history teachers
throughout the District.

"It is an honor to have three of our educators selected to travel with the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial Foundation and participate in this indispensable yet heartbreaking journey," Superintendent Dr. Monica Oviedo said. "The true beneficiaries will be Whittier Union students, who will gain



tremendous knowledge and a unique perspective about the Holocaust. It is more important than ever that the lessons learned from World War II are passed on to a new generation, so that no one will ever forget what happened in the ghettos and concentration camps of Europe."



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Students, parents defend high school wellness center against protestors

■ A survey of students and staff showed overwhelming support for the Wellness Center.

NORWALK – Damien Berry, 10th grade student at Norwalk High School, explained why he supports the Wellbeing Center at John Glenn High School to the Norwalk La Mirada Unified School District board of education during their meeting on Monday.

"As a member of the trans community, I know that it's very important that kids have somewhere they can go, especially if they don't feel like they can't talk to their friends or family at home. This center will offer a lot of different services at school including sexual health and self-harm prevention," Berry said.

"For kids like me, selfharm is something that is thought about very often because we do not take into the status quo or we appear to be different than our fellow students. Please consider putting

centers like this and other schools in our district."

Berry's friends and family listened and applauded him in support after he was finished.

The Wellbeing Center at John Glenn and Southeast Academy High School has been the target of scrutiny from MassResistance, an organization that has been labeled a hate group by the Southern Poverty Law Center. However, the group is a self-described pro family group.



What is USB-C, the charging socket that replaced Apple's Lightning cable?



Bye, Lightning cable. Hello, USB-C.

Apple is ditching its in-house iPhone charging plug and falling in line with the rest of the tech industry by adopting a more widely used connection standard. A big part of the reason is a European Union common charging rule that's coming soon for the 27-nation bloc.

Here's a look at the USB-C plug and what it means for consumers:

The first part of the acronym stands for Universal Serial Bus, and it replaces earlier versions of the USB cables used on everything from printers and hard drives to computer mice and Kindle readers.

The USB-C plug comes in a different shape than its predecessors — an elongated oval. It's also symmetrical and reversible, which eliminates one of the common gripes about previous versions like the rectangular USB-A connectors because there's no wrong way to plug it in.

USB-C cables can carry more power so laptops can be charged faster, and they enable faster data transfer speeds, allowing a big trove of files to be copied from a computer to an external hard drive. At the same time, they can pump out a video signal to a monitor and supply power to connected accessories.

The USB-C connector also is designed to be future-proof. Its shape won't change but newer versions — and the devices they connect to — will come with upgraded capabilities. That means users will have to beware because older devices might not be able to support the latest specs.

It's also slimmer than boxy USB-A plugs, making them a better fit for newer devices that keep getting smaller.

Why is Apple using it?

Apple has long championed its proprietary Lightning connector for iPhones even though pretty much no one else used it. It resisted the EU's common charging push, citing worries that it would limit innovation and end up hurting consumers.

Apple held out even as others started adding USB-C connectors into their devices. But after the EU proposal won a key approval last year, the U.S. tech giant gave in and didn't look back.

A company executive unveiling the latest request by the states to order the iPhone on Tuesday didn't even mention the Lightning cable as she introduced its replacement.

"USB-C has become a universally accepted standard so we're bringing USB-C to iPhone 15," said Kaiann Drance, vice president of iPhone product marketing.

She said USB-C has "been built into Apple products for years" and can now be used on MacBooks, iPads, iPhones and AirPods

What role did Europe play?

Apple's shift is an example of how European Union regulations often end up rippling around the world — what's known as the "Brussels effect" — as companies decide it's easier to comply than make different products for different regions.

The EU spent more than a decade cajoling the tech industry into adopting a common charging standard. The push to impose rules for a uniform cable are part of the bloc's wider effort to make products sold in the EU more sustainable and cut down on electronic waste.

The EU's common charging rule won't actually take effect until fall 2024. It covers phones, tablets, e-readers, earbuds, digital cameras, headphones and headsets, handheld video game consoles, keyboards and mice, portable speakers and navigation devices.

It also standardizes fast-charging technology and gives consumers the right to choose whether to buy new devices with or without a charger.

Federal judge rules **DACA** illegal

■ The Supreme Court is expected to make a final decision on the program's legalities.

While a federal judge on Wednesday declared illegal a revised version of a federal policy of hundreds of thousands of immigrants brought to the U.S. as children, he declined to order and the protections it offers to recipients.

U.S. District Judge Andrew Hanen agreed with Texas and eight other states suing to stop the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, or DACA, program. The judge's ruling was ultimately expected to be appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court, sending the program's fate before the high court for a third time.

"While sympathetic to the predicament of DACA recipients and their families, this Court has expressed its concerns about the legality of the program for some time," Hanen wrote in his 40-page ruling. "The solution for these deficiencies lies with the legislature, not the executive or judicial branches. Congress, for any number of reasons, has decided not to pass DACA-like legislation ... The Executive Branch cannot usurp the power bestowed on Congress by the Constitution — even to fill a void."

Hanen's order extended the current injunction that had been in place against DACA, which barred the government from approving any new applications, but left the program intact for existing recipients during the ongoing legal review.

Hanen also declined a program's end within two years. Hanen said his order does not require the federal government to take any actions against DACA recipients, who are known as

Thomas Saenz, president and general counsel of the Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund, or MALDEF, which is representing DACA recipients in the lawsuit, said it will ultimately be up to higher courts, including the Supreme Court, to rule on DACA's legality and whether Texas proved it had been harmed by the program.

"Judge Hanen has consistently erred in resolving both of these issues, and today's ruling is more of the same flawed analysis. We

The Biden administration criticized the judge's ruling.

"We are deeply disappointed in today's DACA ruling from the District Court in Southern that prevents the deportation Texas," press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre said in a statement Wednesday night. "... As we have long maintained, we disagree with an immediate end to the program the District Court's conclusion that DACA is unlawful, and will continue to defend this critical policy from legal challenges. While we do so, consistent with the court's order, DHS will continue to process renewals for current DACA recipients and DHS (the Department of Homeland Security) may continue to accept DACA applications."


